We all benefit from the industry every day, whether we realise it or not. Everything in our homes arrived via the logistics network, and the same goes for our shops and businesses. Without it? Sector Spotlight - Transport and logistics

Transport and Logistics

There are many opportunities for a career in the sector. For example, you could drive a heavy goods vehicle (HGV), van or train and be responsible for getting your passengers and cargo to the right place at the right time. It's not just trains that need to run on schedule: at supermarkets, the delivery window for lorries can last a matter of minutes, so drivers have a lot of responsibility.

Alternatively, you might be based in a warehouse or storage facility and be responsible for picking the items to go onto a delivery vehicle, loading them up – perhaps using forklifts or other specialist equipment – and keeping accurate records.

All of these operations require careful planning and overseeing, so there are many supervisory and management roles all the way along the chain. Some involve working with the delivery teams, while others are focused on the end customer, with roles as diverse as scheduling the deliveries for an entire fleet of lorries to managing a train station.

Alternatively, there are roles with businesses like Amazon or eBay, which shift millions of packages every day and rely on huge, sophisticated and hi-tech logistics divisions.

Transport and Logistics skills

The skills you'll need will vary between roles, with different requirements depending on your specialism. Drivers will need specialist training, for example, which requires good motor skills, concentration and the patience to cover long distances, often at antisocial times.

Some aspects of logistics work can be very physical: those lorries don't unload themselves after all, so you could be doing a lot of lifting and carrying, learning how to plan ahead and to use your muscles efficiently and without injury.

You might also need some highly specialised skills depending on the business you work for. Transporting chemicals, fuel or other hazardous materials is obviously risky, so the people involved need to know the properties of the material they're moving and how to do it safely.

Elsewhere in the chain, roles that involve planning, scheduling or creating timetables will demand ICT, literacy and numeracy skills, as well as a good head for organisation and the ability to solve problems. In fact, for any role in transport and logistics, knowing when – and how – to think outside the box will be a handy skill.





- 1. Attend a medical appointment and apply to the DVLA for provisional entitlement to be added to the licence.
- 2. Pass the relevant theory multiple choice and hazard perception (module 1a and 1b) tests.
- 3. Attend driver the training course and sit and pass the module 3a reverse maneuverer test and then sit and pass the module 3b road practical test.
- 4. Get a Certificate of Professional Competence (drivers CPC).
- 5. Apply for a digital tachograph.

Why would Wilson recommend taking this course?

A mentor and friend of Wilson's said he should build on his knowledge to keep up with advancing technology. Wilson wanted to make sure he made the right choice on where he should study.

"I sought to broaden my skills, but combining work and study proved impossible. I am a careful decision maker and, true to form, I spent two months analysing which course to take in an Excel spreadsheet. My criteria were: rankings, personal recommendations, and the most relevant syllabus. When I return to work, I will not only be able to use the latest technology, but I will be more professional and will have more credibility."

Are there many local jobs in the transport and logistics sector?

Wilson gained work experience overseas in Dubai, but it is possible to get jobs in the local area too.

"Industries cannot operate without transport and logistics. Every department has someone who is doing this. In your local supermarket, for example, there is a team behind taking goods from a farm to the store. The industry has developed in the last decade, and now there are far more opportunities."

- to be able to work confidently, and without supervision
- the ability to work quickly and accurately

You will need a minimum of 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C) or equivalent qualifications, including English and maths.

As an Air Traffic Controller, you will use advanced radar and radio communications equipment to pass instructions, advice and information to pilots under your control. You will guide aircraft through the airport's airspace, using radar to track their position, keeping them 'separated' and safe; this must be done efficiently to minimise delays and reduce CO, emissions.

Controllers work in an on-site control tower (known as Aerodrome Controllers) and are responsible for managing aircraft in the immediate vicinity of the airport, ensuring aircraft move safely on the runway, taxiways, and the aircraft parking stands. They also give aircraft their clearances to take-off and land.

The airport also has Approach Controllers who manage aircraft out to much greater distances from the airport (often out to 40 miles from Southend). Approach Controllers will guide approaching aircraft into the most efficient sequence order ahead of landing.

You will start your career as an Air Traffic Control Assistant, supporting controllers by answering operational telephone calls, managing safety-critical information such as aircraft flight plans, and preparing meteorological data. Assistants also provide an extra pair of eyes and ears for the controllers. After you have mastered the Air Traffic Control Assistant role, your aptitude to progress to Air Traffic Controller training will be assessed.

If you are successful, this training is carried out initially at a residential college in Gloucester in the west of England. Having successfully completed college training, you'll return to London Southend and conduct a period of 'on the-job' training under the mentorship of experienced controllers.

Qualified Air Traffic Controllers usually start off in the tower as Aerodrome Controllers. Approach control is normally the second discipline to learn, and the entire process can take up to three years before you are qualified in both. Experienced controllers are currently highly sought-after, and that demand is likely to continue well into the 2030s.

Step-by Step Guide to the UCAS Application Process for 2024

The UCAS (Universities and Colleaes Admissions Service) application process is the system used to apply for undergraduate courses in the UK.

1. Research Courses and Universities

Before you begin your application, spend time researching the courses and universities you are interested in. Key factors to consider include:

- · does the course match your academic interests and career goals?
- do you prefer a city, suburban, or rural setting?
- check the required qualifications (e.g., A-levels, BTECs, IB, etc.) and grade thresholds.
- · think about accommodation, social life, and student support services.

Use resources such as the **UCAS** website, university websites, and open days to gather information.

2. Create a UCAS Account

To begin your application, register for an account on UCAS Hub.

After registering, log in to your account and begin your application.

You will be assigned a UCAS Personal ID that you'll use throughout the application process.

3. Complete your personal information by filling out the required sections in your UCAS account.

You will need to provide:

- name, address, date of birth, etc
- details of your school, college, qualifications (completed and pending)
- include details of any part-time work, internships, or work experience relevant to your course

4. Select your course choices

You can apply for up to five courses in the same application. Options include:

- · five courses at one university
- five courses across multiple universities
- a mixture of courses and universities

You do not have to rank your choices. All universities will receive your application simultaneously and will consider you independently.

5. Write your Personal Statement

The personal statement is a crucial part of your application. It allows you to demonstrate your passion for your chosen course, your achievements, and why you're a good fit for the program. Here's what to focus on:

- why you want to study the course
- your skills and achievements
- career goals

Tips for writing:

- Aim for a concise, well-structured essay (maximum of 4,000 characters or 47 lines).
- Proofread carefully to avoid grammatical errors.
- Draft and redraft your statement for clarity and impact.

6. Obtain a reference

You will need a reference from someone who knows you academically, such as a teacher, tutor, or academic adviser. Make sure to:

- choose someone who is familiar with your academic abilities and potential.
- · give them plenty of time to write your reference
- ensure they know the courses you're applying for

UCAS will request your reference directly, so your referee will need to upload it to your application.

7. Submit Your Application

Before you submit your application, review everything carefully. Make sure all the sections are complete, and that there are no errors or missing information. Once you're satisfied, submit your application and pay the application fee.

If you receive Free School Meals, you may be eligible for financial assistance.

8. Track your application

Once submitted, you can track your application via UCAS Track. This system will notify you of any updates or decisions from universities. Decisions will be one of the following:

Conditional Offer: You'll be accepted if you meet specific conditions, usually exam results.

Unconditional Offer: You've been accepted unconditionally.

Rejection: Your application was unsuccessful.

9. Reply to offers

After receiving all your decisions, you need to choose:

- Firm Choice: Your first-choice course and university.
- Insurance Choice: Your backup option if you do not meet the requirements of your firm choice.

You will need to reply by the date listed in UCAS Track.

10. Results and Clearing

If you receive your results and do not meet the conditions of your firm or insurance choices, or if you don't receive any offers, you can enter clearing. Clearing allows you to find available courses at other universities that still have spots open.

- Clearing opens in July and runs until mid-September.
- If you meet and exceed the conditions of your firm offer, you may be eligible for **adjustment** to find a course with higher entry requirements.

11. Confirmation and Enrolment

Once you've accepted an offer and met the conditions (if applicable), your place will be confirmed. The university will contact you with details on how to enrol, accommodation, and start dates.



Key Deadlines for 2025

15th October 2024

Deadline for Medicine, Veterinary Medicine/Science, and Dentistry courses, as well as all applications to the University of Oxford and the University of Cambridge.

29th January 2025 Main deadline for most undergraduate courses.

30th June 2025

Applications after this date will automatically enter clearing.
